

Winter Competition details:

Winter baseball with Forest Baseball Club allows you to find the team that suits your skills and experience. You must be born on or before August 31st 2010 to be eligible to play.

We play in the Manly Minor League competition and the Pacific Coast Baseball League competition.

- Grades: Typically 4 grades are offered in Winter baseball, with Forest featuring teams in every grade. 1st and 2nd grade is for experienced players. 3rd grade has a mix of experience, abilities and ages. 4th grade is ideal for first time players.
- Season dates: Mid April through to end August, with a break over the June long weekend.
- Venues: Aquatic Reserve Baseball Park, Frenchs Forest, Rat Park, Warriewood and Balgowlah Oval.
- Game days/times: 1st & 2nd Grade: predominantly Saturdays. 3rd & 4th Grade: predominantly Sundays (but some Saturdays may be necessary in 2025 as Aquatic undergoes redevelopment). Games start at 12.00pm or 2.30pm and last for 2 hours (PCBL slightly later times).

Fees: \$380, which includes the annual Baseball Australia and Baseball NSW capitation and insurance charges paid once a year (\$137), Manly Association fees (\$95), Forest Club fee (\$40), Ground Infrastructure Levy (\$25) as well as a GameDay portal levy (\$13) and all umpiring charges (\$70).

If you played Summer baseball in 2024/25 – fees are ~\$240 (as capitation fees already paid).

- Equipment needed: You just need to supply your own baseball glove and cleats (soccer boots, for example, are also ok).
